#### Livelihood Initiatives

### Training on Palm Leaf Product Diversification and Marketing

- A one-day training cum orientation was organized for the beneficiaries engaged in palm leaf basket making at Thamaraikulam village.
- 37 women beneficiaries attended this program and became familiar with palm leaf product marketing aspects.
- This program motivated the women beneficiaries to take up this activity for income generation.

## Awareness Camp on Integrated Farming System (IFS)

- A program on 'Promotion and Popularization of Climate Resilient Integrated Farming System for optimized yield leading to livelihood enhancement of small and marginal farmers in Ariyalur District' was inaugurated in Eluppaiyur village. Around 25 farmers attended this inauguration program.
- A total of 18 awareness camps were organized, where **472 farmers** participated and learned about integrated farming and organic farming practices.

**75 farmers** will be selected and will be provided 3 days training at KVK on Integrated Farming Systems (IFS).

Skill development of rural youth plays a vital role in unlocking their potential and creating avenues for a brighter future. By providing tailored training programs and workshops, we equip them with the tools to excel in various trades and professions. This not only enhances their employability but also empowers them to contribute effectively to their communities' growth and development.

#### **Inauguration of CRM Batch**

The first batch of trainees in CRM trade was inaugurated in the month of may. Shri Vaidhyanathan, CSR head, Karun Vaishya Bank inaugurated the batch.

In the first batch of HHA around 17 students attended and completed the three-month HHA course. The trainees were taken to MMIMS Hospital in Ariyalur for their training.

The trained students will be assisted in securing placements in Home Health Care in Ariyalur, Trichy, and Chennai, with an average monthly become of Rs. 12,000 per month.

# A SUCCESSFUL CASE STUDY UNDER GRAM PARIVARTAN PROJECT

Oppannan, 48, lives Shri in O. village. Ottakovil Krishnapuram Panchayat, Ariyalur Block, with his wife and their two school-going children. The family owns 2 acres of irrigated land, cultivating paddy, vegetables, and maize, and they also rear 3 cows, 2 calves, and 5 goats. Oppannan attended the project orientation program organized by DBF, where he shared concerns about milk production and fodder crops. He highlighted issues with milk storage leading to wastage.

DBF supported him with a 10-liter milk can, facilitating easier milk transportation to the Aavin society. He now sells around 16 liters of milk daily from his 2 cows, saving approximately 250 ml of milk from wastage each day, thus increasing his income. VDF also provided guidance on livestock care, veterinary care, fodder production, and animal health. Understanding the importance of fodder crop intervention, Oppannan began cultivating CO 5 on his land, significantly reducing fodder costs.



# SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE

#### General Medical Camp

- A general health camp was organized in Nallampathi village, located near the plant area.
- The camp was conducted by MMIMS Hospital, Ariyalur.
- A total of 60 individuals from the village benefited from this initiative.
- It helps the villagers to receive free doctor consultations in their village and obtain basic medicines at no cost.
