LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



De-worming camp in progress

De-worming and vaccination Camp for goats

- De-worming was performed for 120 goats.
- De-worming aids in faster growth and weight gain.
- Periodic deworming is effective in reducing the mortality rate among goats.
- An awareness session was conducted for goat-rearing farmers, focusing on breed selection, disease management, and feeding patterns.

Poly-house Protective Farming

- Seven farmers were linked with the Poly House protective farming scheme.
- The farmers invested Rs. 16,800/-
- Protective farming, with its ability to control pests and sunlight, aids in faster plant growth and optimal yield.
- Farmers reported a net income of Rs. 2,20,500/-, approximately 20% more than their routine income.

Vermi compost beds

- 700 small and marginal farmers were supported with vermi compost units.
- Each unit can produce 1 ton of compost manure, sufficient for 1 acre of land.
- Consequently, the initiative is expected to bring around 700 acres of land under bio inputs for agriculture.

Azolla Cultivation

- 180 beneficiaries with cattle received Azolla beds
- Out teams have seen good results in cows in terms of increased quantity and quality of milk.
- Azolla reduces feed costs incurred by farmers by replacing a considerable quantity of branded feeds
- Azolla is being used by poultry and goat-rearing farmers too
- Generally, a household having two cows can potentially earn Rs.18k by providing Azolla as a cow feed

Artificial insemination camp organized by BAIF

- 202 sex-sorted artificial inseminations were performed on cows and buffalos.
- Additionally, 692 conventional artificial inseminations were carried out.
- Cumulatively, from April to December, a total of 453 sorted semen inseminations and 1480 conventional inseminations were performed.
- The DBF team anticipates the addition of 300 female calves to the dairy population in the core villages

Mobilization van for agriculture support

- Farmers were informed about advanced agricultural technologies and best practices to optimize sugarcane yield.
- The objective is to diversify income streams through value addition and enhance agricultural productivity.
- Farmers were oriented to understand and adopt sustainable farming practices.
- A total of 313 villages were covered, and 10,662 farmers were engaged through mobilization van services.

- PM Vishvkarma enrollment camp held
- 207 beneficiaries got registered in Pm Vishvkarma Yojana through enrolment Camp

This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

A SUCCESS STORY FROM LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE



Ram Devi's steadfast courage & determination.

Ram Devi, residing in Gazipur village in the Sitapur district, primarily relied on agricultural labor and allied activities for her main household income. With an annual income of Rs. 70,000, she and her husband struggled to meet their family's basic needs but remained steadfast in their commitment to securing a bright future for their children. In pursuit of additional income, Ram Devi explored various avenues and, during an interaction with the DBF team, decided to restart animal husbandry.

She secured a Rs. 25,000 loan from her SHG and invested Rs. 15,000 from her savings, marking the beginning of her journey to generate a minimum additional income of Rs. 4,500 to 5,000 per month through milk sales. As a considerate mother, she set aside 2 liters of milk for her family's self-consumption, ensuring a balanced nutritional intake.

Ram Devi looks forward to expanding her milch animal count with the support of a DBF-funded breed improvement project in Jawaharpur. Her determination to thrive as a dairy farmer serves as an inspiration for others to follow in her footsteps.
