WATER CONSERVATION INITIATIVES:

- Identified water harvesting work sites at Nawabpeta village in association with Village Watershed Development Committee
- Place finalized to construct 1 new Village pond, and one old pond identified for renovation
- Site survey and civil estimates completed
- 3600m³ of water harvesting potential likely to get added

AGRICULTURE AND LIVESTOCK:

- An awareness session conducted to promote Artificial Insemination with Sex Sorted Semen (AI-SSS) conducted at Nawabpeta village.
- 50 farmers participated
- AD- Animal Husbandry, Veterinary Officer & their team interacted with the participants
- Households are being identified to avail this facility
- The targeted villages are likely to get 300 buffalo calves added in the next 12 months.

Innovative project

Sanitary pad making is the project to be implemented by 'Shanthi SHG', a women self help group of Chinnakomerla village. DBF facilitated sanctioning of this project from NAB Foundation (a subsidiary of NABARD). Main objective of this project is to create access to affordable menstrual hygiene products among rural women, and create sustainable livelihood for women involved in pad making. NABARD has sanctioned Rs. 5.38 Lakhs as grant, SHG had contributed Rs. 0.75 Lakh and support from DBF is Rs. 0.25 Lakh. Total cost of the project is Rs. 6.38 Lakh. Necessary machinery and equipment have been received by 'SHG' recently from 'Saral Design', an approved vendor of NABARD. NAB Foundation will further support the SHG with trainings and marketing. SHG will begin the Sanitary Pad production in the month of November. These women will have the capacity to produce 1440 pads per day. And they will optimize their production as they strengthen their marketing.

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.
