LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



Mini Garment Unit

- → 200 SHG women were identified and trained in making decorative lights from our core area village.
- → Each woman has the potential to earn an income of Rs. 1.20 lakhs per annum.

- → A small garment unit was established in Porle tarf Thane village.
- → 50 women were benefited from this unit.
- → DBF has supported the unit by contributing the machinery and assisting in setting up the garment unit.
- → Each woman has the potential to earn Rs. 1.29 lakhs annually from this initiative.

Large Poultry Farm Set up

- → 10 self-help group (SHG) women are engaged in painting clay idols. Santosh Agency provides all raw materials and handles marketing.
- → 10 clay arts prepared in a day.
- → Each woman has the potential to earn an income of Rs. 1.57 lakhs annually.

Vermi Compost

- → 41 SHG members purchased buffaloes through loans from Bank of India.
- → Each household has the potential to earn an additional annual income of Rs. 92,200/-.

- 600 vermi compost beds were distributed to farmers.This soil-friendly livelihood initiative has the potential
- This soil-friendly livelihood initiative has the potential to produce over 600 tons of compost manure in a year.
- → The application of compost manure reduces input costs and improves soil health.
- → Farmers are expected to earn an additional income of Rs. 25,000/- annually from this initiative.


- → 4,000 Dual Purpose Cross Country poultry birds distributed to 80 beneficiaries.

- Each farmer has the potential to earn an additional income of Rs. 55,000/- annually.





The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress communities, where household chosen for participation is within selected expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURAL FARMING

Mrs. Sunanda Hambirarao Ghodake, a resident of Darewadi village, relies on agriculture for her family's livelihood. With a 1-acre farm where sugarcane and paddy are the major crops, she sought additional support through the DBF's 'Gram Parivartan Project. She acquired a Vermi Compost Bed and received comprehensive guidance on its usage to enhance crop quality and production.

Following the advice, she implemented vermi composting in her farm. She decided to plant brinjal alongside sugarcane, using only vermi compost as fertilizer and spraying vermi wash liquid for brinjal plant growth. By adopting organic farming practices, she avoided purchasing additional fertilizers from the market.

As a result, the brinjal plants got cultivated in Mrs. Ghodake's farm exhibited remarkable improvements in color, size, and freshness. This led to higher market prices for her produce. Presently, she has harvested 285 kg of brinjal, fetching her a profit of over Rs. 17,000.

SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE

- → Under the One Station One Product scheme, one food stall was set up at Kolhapur Railway station run by Manjula Mahila SHG.
- → The products displayed at their stall includes, pickles, jaggery, wafers etc.
- → They have earned Rs.22,800/- in one month by selling these food products.





Medical Camp

→ A health and awareness program was organized for H&T laborers in the cane fields, during which sanitary napkin pads were distributed to 100 H&T women laborers.

- → One Medical Camp was organized for Majagaon Villagers.
- → 93 Farmers and women, benefited from this camp.
- → The beneficiaries also received medicines prescribed for their illness.



Health Awareness Program

- → A veterinary camp was organized with Zilla Parishad Doctor Mr. Suraj Kambale for conducting health checkups for the animals.
- → 50 beneficiaries participated in this camp, where free medicines and guidance on animal care and increasing milk production were provided.



Organized Veterinary Camp

→ 50-specially abled children of an orphanage home managed by Umed Foundation were supported through distribution of food grains and other basic amenities.

- → Celebrated Republic Day where 230 beneficiaries participated.
- → Activity like dance was performed in the event by school students.
