### LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



#### **Distribution of Vermicompost Beds**

- 450 Vermi Compost beds distributed.
- This soil-friendly livelihood initiative has the potential to produce over 400 tons of compost manure.
- The application of compost manure reduces input costs and improves soil health.
- Farmers are likely to earn a net additional income of Rs. 22,000 annually.

# **Distribution of Soldering Kits to women** beneficiaries

- 150 soldering kits were distributed to women beneficiaries.
- Women involved in making decorative lights received the tools.
- Using these tools, these women earned around Rs. 350 per day.
- This initiative has created earning potential exceeding Rs.1 lakh in about 150 households.





- A small garment unit has been established in Darewadi village.
- Ten women associated with self-help groups are involved in this initiative.
- These women earn around Rs. 300 per day.
- The income potential of these women exceeds Rs. 1 lakh per year

#### Purchase of Buffalos through bank loan

- 41 SHG members purchased buffaloes.
- All of them linked with banks to avail loans for this purchase.
- Due to this new addition of animals, households stand to earn a net additional income of Rs. 1 lakh every year.





### **Poultry Farm**

- 10 SHG members are involved in poultry farm initiative.
- The unit was started in June and two batches of chicken have been sold so far.
- For each batch the net profit is around Rs. 90,000.

#### Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

## A SUCCESS STORY FROM LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE



Savita Shivaji Mane, a 42-year-old resident of Darewadi village located 3 kms away from the sugar plant, is a member of an SHG created by DBF named Renuka Mahila Bachat Samuh

Savita's family needed a more reliable income to meet their financial requirements, rompting them to search for a feasible livelihood option for additional earnings. Recognizing Savita's creditworthiness, the DBF team suggested she apply for a bank loan to purchase a buffalo. With support from DBF team members, Savita successfully secured a Rs. 70,000 SHG Loan from the Bank of India, enabling her to acquire a high-yielding breed of buffalo. Additionally, she participated in a Dairy Business Training Program organized by DBF.

Savita shares, "Every day, my buffalo yields 6 to 8 liters of milk, allowing me to make sales of around Rs. 400 per day. In a month, I earn about Rs. 12,000 through the sale of milk. I plan to add one more buffalo to my livestock soon.

This has been very helpful for me and my family, and I am grateful to the DBF team for guiding me in purchasing a buffalo for my livelihood."
