LIVELIHOOD ACTIVITIES

- 50 women trained to operate motorized sewing machines and stitch.
- They were trained by Aradhya Agency, who supported these women to set up a mini garment unit.
- Aradhya Agency supplied raw materials free of cost on a buy back arrangement for finished products.
- Women earn Rs.350 in this garment unit. They have job throughout the year.

- Making decorative light strings is a promising activity for the women of Kolhapur.
- On a buy back arrangement with the buyer, 60 women belonging to self help groups came together to make the light strings in Asurle village.
- Women on producing lights with desired quantity and quality are given Rs.350 per day.

- A multipurpose loan of Rs.22 lakhs distributed to the self help group members Tarf, Thane.
- The linkage was successfully established with Bank of India, Porle.
- The funds are primarily used for livestock and agriculture by the members of the five SHGs who received the loans.

Large Poultry set up at Darewadi village

- Members of 5 self help groups came together to start a large size poultry unit in Darewadi
- Each batch can produce 5000 Chicks
- With this variety of chicken, the women can dispatch 6 batches of full grown birds
- Total earnings per annum is Rs.6 lakhs.

- A group of 10 SHG Women started painting of clay idols.
- This activity is done in collaboration with Santosh Agency on a buy back arrangement basis. All required raw material is supplied by the agency.
- Rs.150 is the earnings for women per idol, and these women paint 3 idols every day leading to Rs.450 per day.
- Each woman engaged in this painting activity has the potential to earn more than Rs.1 lakh annually.

Rohit Rajendra Lohar, 32 years old, hails from Yavluj village of Panhala Taauka. His father is a farmer, and mother is a housewife. Family had challenges to meet the household expenses. A reliable income for the family was much required as income from farm was not predictable. For Rohit who was looking for a way to earn a consistent income, the Assistant Electrician training came as a right solution. At DIKSHA Kolhapur, Rohit got trained to handle the job of an electrician and gained skills to repair electronic items too. He expresses great acknowledgement for the DIKSHA faculties and all the training facilities that helped him to get skilled as an electrician. Today, Rohit is a reliable electrician with required skill set to shine in the job market. He earns Rs.1.92 Lakhs annually. This income in addition to the income from the farm, helps the family stay economically more stable.
