LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



- Scientific goat-rearing training aims to equip selected farmers with essential skills and knowledge, along with best practices, for effective and sustainable goat farming.
- → 1279 beneficiaries have received training on scientific goat rearing.
- → Our target is to provide training to 1355 households from 12 core villages.

Goat Rearing Training

- → Three Village Development Facilitators (VDFs) participated in a goat rearing training program.
- → The comprehensive curriculum covered breed selection, shelter construction, health management, breeding, and marketing.
- Participants gained hands-on experience in goat handling, shelter construction, and feeding practices.
- → Emphasis was placed on health management, disease prevention, and breeding techniques.
- → Insights into market dynamics, pricing, and establishing local market connections were provided.
- → Certificates were issued to VDFs upon successful completion of the training program.

Sewing Machine Distribution

- → 6 Weavers' Group were formed.
- → 144 women are engaged in weaving activity.

- → Distributed Usha Sewing Machines to 36 trained women.
- → The sewing machines were handed over to the beneficiaries by Mr. Padmanabh Chakraborty, Regional Manufacturing Head in the presence of Mr. Uday Singh Rajput, Senior General Manager, Lanka Unit.
- → The beneficiaries are expected to earn an additional income of Rs. 74,400/- lakh per annum.

WATER HARVESTING STRUCTURE




- → A pond is constructed in a village Jirimgaon.

A SUCCESS STORY FROM LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE

In Gosaigaon, a core village of the Gram Parivartan project, Arun Bhuiyan and his family of four encountered adversity when Arun, the primary breadwinner, suffered a bike accident that left his hand paralyzed. With their livelihood at stake, Arun's wife, Ringku, took on the responsibility of providing for the family. Trained as a tailor, she possessed the skill to stitch various types of clothes but faced limitations due to working with an old, frequently malfunctioning sewing machine. The family's modest income prevented them from purchasing a new machine, hindering Ringku from realizing her full potential.

Ringku sought assistance from the Gram Parivartan team, highlighting their pressing need for a new sewing machine. Recognizing Ringku's skills and the family's reliance on her income, the team selected her as a beneficiary for the much-needed equipment. With the arrival of the new sewing machine, she has started to get orders for stitching different types of dresses.

Ringku's increased productivity translated into a significant boost in earnings, with her monthly additional income of Rs 7000 rupees.
