This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

A SUCCESS STORY FROM LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE



Jieena Enghieepi, a resilient mother of three in her forties, has found a source of empowerment through the Hawaipur Jirim Gaon Rural Haat. Every Saturday, she travels two hours via autorickshaw to this marketplace, a collaborative effort between NABARD and Dalmia Bharat Foundation, seeking stability and predictability in her life.

Completed in October 2019, the Rural Haat provides shelter for 30-50 vendors, mostly women, who previously faced challenges selling their produce in local markets due to harsh weather conditions. The market shed has become a crucial blessing, offering relief from the relentless heat and unpredictable rain.

Before the Rural Haat, women like Jieena struggled with meager returns and uncertain conditions while selling their produce. Local shopkeepers acknowledge the positive transformation, recognizing the market shed as a haven for those who travel from distant villages to sell their goods.

Participating in the Rural Haat has allowed Jieena to earn an additional income of ₹12,000 per month. This financial boost contributes significantly to her overall economic well-being, providing stability and improving her quality of life. Jieena's story is just one of many. The Rural Haat goes beyond being a market; it serves as a catalyst for positive change. Inspired by Jieena's commitment, numerous women have found renewed purpose within this space, beyond just economic opportunities.

Jieena's regular presence at the Haat symbolizes the impact of this initiative. The Rural Haat is not merely a market; it is a transformative force in the lives of rural women. The construction of the market shed has created a positive ripple effect, providing not only economic opportunities but also fostering dignity and purpose in the community.
