Livelihood/Water Initiatives

Ginger Cultivation

- 47 households supported for Ginger Cultivation from four core villages under Gram Parivartan project.
- Households motivated to cultivate Ginger in commercial scale for selling the produce in local weekly markets.
- Households are expected to earn an additional income of Rs. 24,000 per annum.



Promotion of piggery fattening unit

- 5 Households were supported for putting up piggery fattening units providing Rs.
 2,500 for purchasing one piglet.
- Households purchased one piglet for fattening.
- Households will sell meat at Rs. 430 to 470 per kg and purchase another piglet for raising, fattening and selling of meat.
- Households are expected to earn an additional income of Rs. 50,000 per annum.





Promotion of Piggery Breeding unit

- Households received Rs. 5,000 each to start piggery units, buying two piglets costing Rs. 10,000. Pigs breed twice yearly, yielding 7 to 14 piglets per litter, which households sell for extra income.
- 19 households were benefitted from this initiative.
- Households are expected to earn an additional income of Rs. 1,01,000 per annum.

Poultry chicks for backyard poultry farming

- 195 Households were supported with 10 Kuroiler chicks of 4 weeks old for backyard poultry farming.
- Supported households will rear Kuroiler chicks for egg production and sell both eggs and mature male hens in the local market for extra income.
- Households are expected to earn an additional income of Rs. 29,400 per annum.

Training on Poultry rearing

- Training on Poultry rearing conducted in collaboration with MSRLS.
- 49 beneficiaries participated in the training program from 6 villages
- This initiative aims to capacitated the poultry beneficiaries on poultry rearing practices for reducing mortality and increasing income from the activity

Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

Success Story on Livelihood interventions under Gram Parivartan Project

Sonita Pala aged 42 years is a resident of Moosiang Lamare New village. She with her husband is taking care for their family of 5, two son and one daughter. The primary source of livelihood of the family is from wages under NREGA, and ration under PDS. For meeting the growing need of the family, she started piggery farming and Broom cultivation since 2020. She has been maintaining her pig breeding farm and producing piglets twice a year. Piglets produced were providing her additional income for the family, however, due to lack of expertise and frequent infestation of diseases, few of the piglets used to die after birth in every breeding cycle. This has been hindering her realizing potential income from the activity.



During the mobilization drive under Gram Parivartan project in the village, the VDF selected her for support of supplements for piggery and Broom Post Harvest Management intervention. Accordingly, she got trained on piggery farming and provided support of mineral mixture, immunity booster and deworming medicine of her piggery farm. During the intervention she was having one pregnant sow and as instructed in the training, she maintained the sow properly with supplements. In the month of February, the sow delivered 10 healthy piglets and the piglets survived till weaning age. Out of the 10 piglets she has sold 6 piglets at Rs. 5000 each thereby earning an additional income of Rs. 30000. The remaining piglets are being raised for expansion of the pig breeding unit looking into the potential of the activity. She was also supported for Broom Post Harvest Management to enhance income from the Broom grass harvest. The activity has ensured proper quality maintenance of the harvested broom thereby realizing her descent rate of the produce in the market. She has also earned an additional income of Rs. 25000 from the Broom Post Harvest Management activity.

With the supports provided and techniques learned from the trainings provided by DBF, she is confident to continue the activities and looking forward growing her pig herd for sustainable income generation from the activity for her family.
