LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES

VERMI COMPOSTING FOR SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

- Vermicompost enhances root growth and nutrient absorption, improving the soil's macro and micro-nutrient status.
- Each vermicompost unit can produce **1 ton of compost annually**, sufficient for 1 acre of land, **saving around ₹22,000 in input costs**.
- A follow-up on 115 vermicompost pits yielded a total production of **345 quintals**, with a production cost of ₹4,14,000 (at ₹1,200 per quintal).



NEW MICRO ENTERPRISES



New Micro Enterprises

- Four micro-enterprises were established in the core village, including three kirana shops and one cosmetic shop.
- Through our Micro-Enterprise (ME) intervention, beneficiaries were provided with ₹10,000 each to support the launch of their individual enterprises, strengthening sustainable livelihoods.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income ranging from ₹1.08 to ₹1.2 lakhs

GOAT FARMING

- Goat farming serves as a sustainable source of livelihood through the sale of goat meat and offspring (kids).
- 100 beneficiaries were supported.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of ₹30,000 to ₹35,000 through goat rearing.

SUPPORT TO POTTERS

- Provided pottery equipment to 2 beneficiaries to enhance their income and financial independence by boosting their production capacity.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of ₹72,000 to ₹80,000.



DAIRY DEVELOPMENT THROUGH SORTED AND CONVENTIONAL AI

- The BAIF initiative promotes artificial insemination (AI) to improve milch animal genetics, enhancing dairy production and increasing income for rural households through higher milk yield and better-quality dairy products.
- A total of 53 conventional AI procedures and 42 short-duration AI procedures were conducted benefitting 37 households.

IRESA BASED BIOGAS PLANTS



IRESA Based Biogas Plants

- Provided IRESA-based biogas plants to mitigate health hazards caused by smoke in poorly ventilated rural households that rely on dung cakes and firewood for cooking.
- 3 beneficiaries benefited from this intervention.
- The initiative is expected to generate annual savings of ₹22,800 per beneficiary, including ₹900 monthly on LPG and approximately ₹12,000 from using slurry.
- The IRESA-based biogas plant will be replicated for 43 farmers with the support of the District Rural Development Agency.
