LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES

TRAINING ON SCIENTIFIC AND INTEGRATED FISH FARMING



- In collaboration with the District Fishery Development Office, organized a three-day training on Scientific and Integrated Fish Farming.
- 44 fish farmers benefited from the training program
- The training focused on enhancing skills in pond management, breeding, disease control, and value-added fish products to improve productivity and profitability in fish farming.



GOAT REARING



Goat rearing

- A total of **34 households** benefited from the goat rearing initiative.
- Each family received 4 goats, with **136 goats** distributed overall to boost their household income.
- Each household is projected to earn an additional **annual income of ₹60,000 to ₹75,000** through goat farming.

GOATERY MANAGEMENT

- **Five camps** were organized for goat-rearing farmers, focusing on effective goat management practices to support their livelihoods in goat farming.
- A total of **456 goats** were vaccinated, dewormed, and provided with liver and iron supplements to improve their health and productivity benefiting 105 households.
- Each household is expected to generate an additional **annual income of ₹50,000** from goat farming.



Goatery management

DUCK REARING

- **223 households** received **10 ducklings each** as part of the livelihood support program.
- Each household is expected to earn an **annual income of Rs. 50,000**.

FISH FARMING

- **1,890 kg of fingerlings** were distributed to the beneficiaries as a source of livelihood through fish farming.
- **460 households** received these fingerlings.
- Each household has the potential to earn an additional **annual income of ₹80,000**.

MICRO ENTERPRISE

- Under the Gram Parivartan Project's micro-enterprise support initiative, **2 fast food stalls and 2 pani-puri stalls** were successfully established to create sustainable livelihood opportunities for local beneficiaries.
- Each household has the potential to earn an additional **annual income of ₹80,000**.

BAMBOO PLANTATION

- In **28 villages**, nearly **2,000 people** were mobilized to take part in a bamboo plantation initiative.
- This initiative benefited **1,206 farmers** and led to the **planting of 37,951 saplings**, encouraging sustainable growth throughout the region.
