# LIVELIHOOD / WATER INITIATIVES



## PIGGERY BREEDING UNIT



Piggery Breeding unit

- **16 Households** received support to establish pig breeding units, enabling them to sell the piglets for extra income.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 1 lakh.

## PIGGERY FATTENING UNIT

- **Five households** were supported in setting up piggery fattening units, each receiving a piglet for fattening.
- Each household is expected to earn an annual income of ₹50,000.

## DUCKERY BREEDING UNIT

- **15 households** were supported with ₹2,000 each to establish Duckery Breeding Units, acquiring 10 ducks per household.
- Each household is expected to sell at least **40 ducks annually** for meat, generating an income of ₹34,000 per year.

## GOATERY BREEDING UNIT

- **Nine households** were supported in purchasing two adult goats each to establish Goatry Breeding Units.
- Each household is expected to earn an annual income of ₹71,600 through goat breeding.

## MICRO ENTERPRISES

- **Two households** received ₹10,000 each to establish micro-enterprises of general store and fast food stall, enabling them to purchase necessary assets and start selling locally.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of ₹1,00,000.

## SEEDS DISTRIBUTION FOR MAIZE CULTIVATION

- Households received maize seeds and organic pesticides from the District Agriculture Office, Khleihriat, under the NFSM Scheme to cultivate Rabi maize, which they will sell in the local market after harvesting.
- **40 households** were benefited.
- Each household is expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 25,000.

The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

## A CASE STUDY

### Success Story on Livelihood interventions under Gram Parivartan Project

Mestina Rymbai, 28, from Chiehruphi village, supports her family through NREGA wages and PDS rations. In 2020, she began piggery farming and broom cultivation but faced challenges due to lack of expertise and frequent livestock diseases, limiting her income.

In 2023-24, through the Gram Parivartan project, Mestina was selected for support in establishing a Piggery Breeding Unit and Broom Post Harvest Management. After receiving training and financial assistance, her sow produced 17 piglets, and she earned ₹15,000 from selling 3 piglets. She also earned ₹25,000 through improved broom management. Mestina now plans to expand her piggery, securing a stable income for her family.



# SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE



## PROVIDED SPORTS MERCHANDISE TO THE THANGSKAI TIGER SPORTS CLUB

- The Thangskai Tiger Sports Club consisting of **18 members** received support in the form of jerseys, boots, footballs, and other sports items to encourage youth participation in various tournaments and promote sports.

- A literacy and financial literacy program, along with a Domestic Data Entry Operator course, was introduced to enhance digital and employability skills among youth.
- **56 candidates** were benefited.

- **52 beneficiaries** participated in the celebrations.
