

Dairy Units

- **14 dairy farmers** were supported with Jersey milking cows to enhance dairy farming.
- Beneficiaries are expected to sell milk for at least nine months, producing an average of 10 liters per day.
- Each beneficiary is projected to **earn an annual** income of ₹1 lakh.

GOAT REARING

70 households were supported for enhancing their livelihood opportunities through goat rearing.

Each beneficiary has the potential to earn **an**

annual income of Rs. 48,000 from this intervention.



SHG FORMATION

- A Women's Self-Help Group (SHG) Association was established, comprising 12 SHGs from Kallakudi and Palaniyandinagar.
- **60 women members** were associated.

Mushroom Cultivation

- 21 families were supported with 400 beds for cultivating paddy straw mushrooms in two stages, tapping the strong market demand. Each bed yields an average of 1 kg of mushroom.
- Each beneficiary has the potential to earn an annual income of Rs.96,000.

Digital Literacy

A general health camp was organized in the surrounding villages, providing access to basic medical services and health check-ups. The
