# LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES

IRESA BASED BIOGAS PLANTS



This project promotes sustainable living, improves quality of life, and supports environmental conservation for beneficiaries while providing a hygienic, eco-friendly, and healthy cooking environment that significantly reduces kitchen drudgery for women.

- **3 households** received IRESA-based biogas plants under the Gram Parivartan project.
- Each beneficiary has a potential **to save an annual amount of Rs. 1.44 lakhs.**

This model will be replicated with 50 farmers with the support of DRDA (Dist. Rural Development Agencies).

## MICRO ENTERPRISES



Micro Enterprises

- **21 Micro Enterprises** were started under Gram Parivartan Project.
- The program aimed to support the enterprises in reaching financial stability and sustainability.
  - 21 beneficiaries experienced increase in income.
  - Each enterprise has a potential to earn an **annual** income of Rs. 1.32 lakhs.

#### VISHWAKARMA SHRAM SAMMAN YOJANA

The Vishwakarma Shram Samman Yojana aims to empower skilled artisans and craftspeople by enhancing their economic well-being and preserving traditional trades.



The DBF Team collaborated with the District Industries Center

to enroll 70 beneficiaries, who received toolkits for their respective trades post training.

The trained artisans have launched their businesses in carpentry, confectionery, and basket making.

Each artisan has a potential to earn an **annual** income of Rs. 1.44 lakhs.

## AZOLLA CULTIVATION

- Distributed azolla units with the aim to support livestock nutrition and provides significant economic benefits.
  - **250 households produced 7,500 kg of azolla**, which is used to feed their livestock, including buffalo and goats.

Each household has a potential to saves Rs. 3.75 lakhs annually.



#### SARAYAN KUSH MATS SUPPLIED TO PepsiCo

PepsiCo has incorporated Kush mats as bedding in their logistics operations, strategically focusing on empowering women. By prioritizing women for the production and supply of these mats, PepsiCo aims to integrate them into the supply chain and enhance their financial independence.

- **250 women** were benefitted with sustainable income opportunities.
- A group of beneficiaries has a potential to **earn** an annual income is Rs. 1.4 lakhs.

### VERMI COMPOST

Distributed vermi compost bags with an aim to promote soil health, enhances crop yields, and provides significant economic benefits to the farmers, supporting sustainable agriculture in the region.

In this quarter, the production **enhanced by 3,330 quintals** of vermicompost.

Through this sustainable farming practice, 1,000 farmers saved an annual amount of Rs. 3.6 lakhs.

#### DAIRY DEVELOPMENT THROUGH AI

- Through BAIF, DBF promotes dairy production by using artificial insemination (AI). This initiative aims to improve milk yield and overall dairy production efficiency in the region, as milch animals serve as a primary livelihood
- 78 conventional AI and 14 shorted AI procedures were conducted.
- **86 individuals** were benefitted enhancing their dairy productivity and livelihood sustainability.

## **CASE STUDY**

#### Empowerment through Entrepreneurship

Kiran and her husband Arjun, residents of Bartal village in Sitapur, both born with disabilities, faced significant financial challenges without land or other income sources. Recognizing their need for a sustainable livelihood, Dalmia Bharat Foundation (DBF) assisted them in launching a general store, aptly named "Kiran General Store." The couple secured a Self-Help Group (SHG) loan of ₹30,000, along with an additional ₹10,000 from DBF to fund their venture.

This support transformed their lives, allowing Kiran to earn a net monthly income of ₹9,000 to ₹10,000, providing them with much-needed financial security and stability. Kiran and Arjun can now support their family comfortably, highlighting the power of targeted assistance and entrepreneurship in uplifting marginalized communities. Their journey exemplifies resilience and the profound impact of well-directed support.

3 Farmers were supported to construct Climate Resilient Cattle Shed under the Gram Parivartan project.

These sheds were designed for the welfare of the beneficiaries' cattle, leading to a notable increase in milk productivity, improved animal breeding, and enhanced overall health.

Through this initiative, the milk production is increased by 1litter per day.

This initiative will be replicated with 100 farmers through the MGNREGA Scheme with Zila panchayat, as the team has already submitted 120 forms.

#### COMMON SERVICE LAB

Common Service Lab is established to enhance the capacity for digital transactions and online services within the community.

- 125 Beneficiaries were trained in Digital and Financial Literacy.
- 105 members received benefits through E-citizen Services.
