LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



Azolla Pit Distribution

- 250 azolla pits were distributed to farmers to enhance quality and yield
- Each farmer has the potential to earn an additional annual income of Rs. 18,500.

- 30 Sewing machines were distributed to women beneficiaries to promote self-employment.
- Each woman has the potential to earn an annual income of Rs. 75,000/-

One Station One Product

- Supported 04 new micro-enterprises such as E-Rikshaw, Cosmetic shop and garment shop.
- The expected annual income from these enterprises is ranging from Rs.1,80,000/- to 2,52,000/-

- Two stalls were established under the One Station One Product Scheme, benefiting 250 women.
- One stall was established by Mrs. Kumkum Pathak member of Lakshmi SHG group at Tilhar station and the second stall was established by Sarayan FPO at Shahjahanpur station.
- The products displayed in the stalls were Moonj Craft and Zari Zardozi.
- Net Income generated from each stall Rs 5500 in a month



Micro-Enterprises

- 1675 conventional AI procedures and 386 shorted AI procedures were conducted, resulting in AI birth of 445 calves, including 253 female calves.
- By treating 867 animals through infertility camps, this project addressed critical health concerns, thereby enhancing the overall well-being and productivity of dairy animals.
- Each beneficiary has the potential to earn an additional annual amount of Rs. 83,400/-

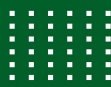


Dairy Development through AI

- 43 households were covered under the Zari Zardozi training program, aimed at empowering women through skill development in traditional handicrafts.
- Each woman has the potential to earn an additional annual amount of Rs.24,000/-

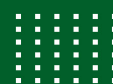
- Training sessions were organized for 10,180 sugarcane farmers in command area villages , focusing on enhancing agricultural practices among sugarcane farmers.
- The training sessions facilitated the adoption of improved agricultural practices among sugarcane farmers, potentially leading to increased yields and income, thereby contributing to agricultural sustainability and improved economic outcomes.

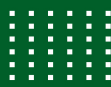
Sugarcane Farmers Training through Audio-Visual

PM Vishwakarma Scheme



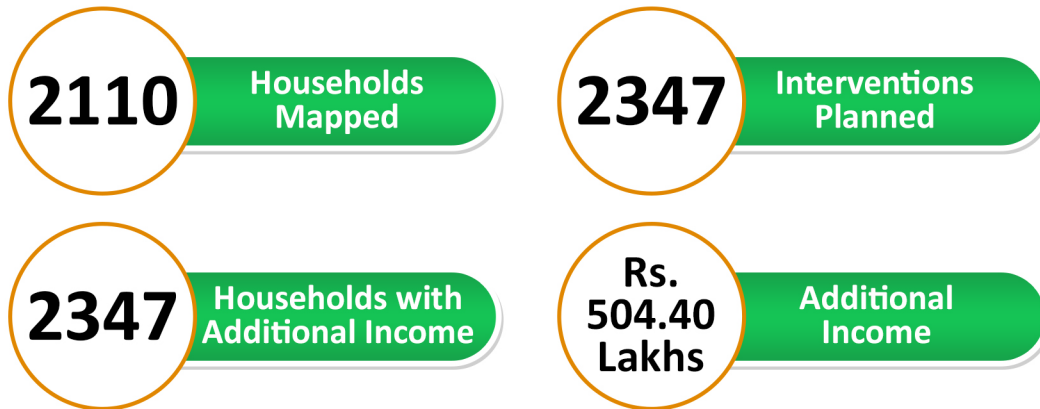


GRAM PARIVARTAN PROJECT

Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

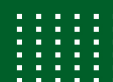

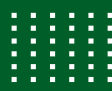

A SUCCESSFUL CASE STUDY

Kumkum Pathak, a resident of Kudirna Village, has been a source of inspiration for thousands of women in Shahjahanpur district and scripting a success story by adopting three livelihood activities i.e. General Store, Cement Information Board making and Pickle making. She has not only changed her economic status, but also shown a way to other woman who are solely dependent on daily wages for sustainable livelihood.

For Kumkum, attending meeting of Dalmia Bharat Foundation for Self Help Group in Kudirna Village was a turning point. After knowing the benefits, she joined Laxmi Self Help Group on May, 2019. During the meetings, she came to know about different types of livelihoods. Being motivated, she started a small general store at her house by taking Rs. 10,000/- as loan from SHG.

Kumkum said, “My income gradually increased after starting the shop and I earned Rs 100 to Rs 200 per day. With these earnings, I have not only repaid the loan to SHG, but also used it for other daily needs. I again took loan for another venture for Cement Information Board making. And from this, I earn up to Rs 1,500/- per board. I have also started Pickle making.”

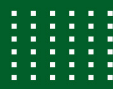
Seeing her sincerity and leadership skills, Kumkum was chosen as a Samoh Sakhi in Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission. While she was working in this role for about a year, she learned about formation of SHG and documentation work.

Recalling the hardships, Kumkum said her family income was dependent entirely on agriculture earlier. However, it was insufficient for the family and they took loans from money lenders at high interest rates.

She and her family are very thankful to Dalmia Bharat Foundation for providing a sustainable way of income to became a role model for all women.

WATER INITIATIVE

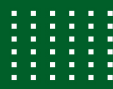


- Underground water pipeline was installed benefitting 327 farmers.
- Each farmer has the potential to earn an additional annual amount of Rs.12,408/- through savings in agriculture.

SOIL FERTILITY IMPROVEMENT:

- 1,000 vermi beds were distributed and 872 Farm Yard Manure (FYM) handed over to farmers.
- Each vermi bed has capacity to produce yield manure up to 1 ton per annum.
- Each beneficiary has the potential to earn an additional annual amount to Rs.22,000/-.

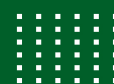

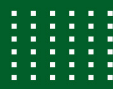

- 42 students were benefitted.

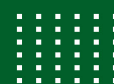


Dual Desk and Benches Distribution

- 350 people were benefitted.



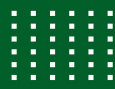

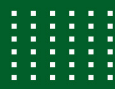

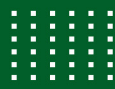
