LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



Vermi Compost

- → A garment stitching unit has been established in Sangli.
- → Mr. Santoshkumar Kumbhar, the Unit Head of Ninaidevi plant, inaugurated this event.
- → 240 self-help group (SHG) women from six villages directly benefited from this initiative.
- → Each woman has the potential to earn an annual additional income of Rs. 75,600.

- → 360 vermicompost beds were distributed to the farmers from five villages.
- → Mr. Santosh Kumar, Unit Head, and Mr. Abbasaheb Salunkhe, Senior Scientist, distributed the compost beds to the farmers.
- → A training on vermicomposting was provided to those farmers.
- → The application of compost manure reduces input costs and improves soil health.
- → Each farmer has the potential to earn an annual additional income of Rs. 25,000.



Garment Unit



- → 700 silage bags were distributed to 300 beneficiaries from 8 core area villages to maximize milk quality and productivity.
- → This initiative has the potential to earn an annual additional income of Rs. 38,300.

Silage Bags for Enhanced Productivity

- → 5.50 lakh sugarcane seedlings were distributed to 300 farmers in our core area villages.
- → This initiative has the potential to generate an annual income of Rs. 55,000.


- → 4000 DP Cross Country Poultry birds were distributed to 160 beneficiaries.

Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress communities, where household chosen for participation is within selected expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

A SUCCESS STORY FROM LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE

Amit Suresh Vibhute, a beneficiary of DBF's micro-enterprise initiative, previously faced challenges in continuing his studies due to temporary medical conditions. Despite multiple attempts at employment with private companies, his physical fitness limitations posed difficulties.

After a careful analysis of the family, it was discovered that Amit's wife is a skilled cook and is willing to prepare food for a larger number of customers. Amit's wife was not a part of any self-help group (SHG) and lacked credit opportunities. The DBF team advised them on an economical model for starting a restaurant with a limited menu, requiring an initial investment of around Rs. 20,000/-.

The couple mobilized the necessary funds, purchased utensils and furniture, and established the restaurant. The DBF team provided continuous guidance to boost sales. With Amit's wife preparing delicious food and Amit effectively managing customer interactions, the customer base grew. Starting in mid-September'23 with a sales of Rs. 10,000 monthly, the family now earns an income of around Rs. 15,000/- per month.

SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE



- Computers were distributed in 10 schools to promote digital learning.
- → 1,266 students were benefitted.

Distribution of computers to schools

- → A general medical camp was organized in Panumbre village.
- → 110 individuals benefited from this camp.
- → The camp was organised in collaboration with the Government Hospital, Shirala.
- → Facilities such as HIV testing, sugar tests, and PB checks were provided to the beneficiaries.
- Beneficiaries received free medicines prescribed for their illness.

- On the occasion of Women's Day, sewing machines were distributed to 36 women beneficiaries of Darewadi village.
- → This initiative has the potential to earn an income of Rs 40,000 annually.
