LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



- → Promoted mushroom cultivation with 338 households.
- → Supported distribution of mushroom spawn along with training for all women interested in mushroom cultivation.
- → Beneficiaries have earned additional income ranging from Rs. 20,000 to Rs. 45,000.

Mushroom Cultivation

- → Kitchen gardens were promoted in 133 households.
- → On-field training and provision of vegetable seedlings were provided for commercial vegetable cultivation.
- → 159 farmers are engaged in commercial vegetable cultivation.
- → Households are now earning a net additional income ranging from Rs. 18,000 to Rs. 35,000 annually in the Rabi season.

Parwal Cultivation

- → Parwal cultivation has begun with 38 progressive farmers from core villages.
- → Field-level training on the Package of Practice for Parwal cultivation was provided to all farmers.
- → The expected annual additional income from Parwal cultivation on a 20-cent area is Rs. 55,000. per beneficiary.

- → 200 Azolla bags were provided to potential farmers to promote organic farming.
- → Azolla is used as livestock feed and biofertilizer.
- → Annual potential input savings and increased production amount to Rs. 18,500 per unit.

Poultry Farming

- Poultry Chicks supported to 1,053 households for backyard poultry.
- → Training programme on poultry rearing was organized in 16 core villages.
- → A mass vaccination of poultry birds in 16 villages is carried out focusing on 50,000 birds to be covered.
- → Expected annual income is Rs. 33,000/- per family.



Goat and Pig Rearing

- → Provided one matured female goat per family for Goat Farming and similarly, one mature female pig per family for pig rearing.
 → Total 310 households were supported for goat rearing.
- → Total 310 households were supported for goat rearing and 40 households for pig rearing.
- → Expected annual additional income is Rs. 26,000 per family from goat farming and Rs. 50,000 per family from pig rearing

- → To promote organic farming, 200 Vermi bags were provided to potential farmers which resulted in establishment of 200 vermi compost units.
- Annually, potential input savings and increased production amount to Rs. 22,000/- per beneficiary.

Income Generation Activity

- → 40 families have received financial assistance for their income generation activities, with an expected additional annual income of Rs. 30,000 per family.
- → 10 households were supported for micro-enterprise initiatives, with an expected additional annual income of more than Rs. 1,00,000.
- → 71 households were supported in initiating new income-generating activities and scaling up existing enterprises through the GP Association, with an expected additional annual income of more than Rs. 1,00,000/-.



WADI (Waste Area Development)

- → 278 acres of waste lands were planted with 20,850 horticulture plants, so far 420 acres covered.
- → 20 nos. of Solar lift irrigation systems installed to provide irrigation facility to 151 acres of land.
- MoU was signed with OAIC for 20 solar lifts, and Electric river lift will be installed aiming to irrigate 100 acres of up-land and leverage amount is Rs.79 Lakhs.

WATER ACTIVITIES

- → Six community ponds renovated in six villages.
- → Completed excavation of land work of 10,010 cubic meters.

Drip Irrigation


- Drip irrigation has been installed covering a total area of 35 acres of land.

In 2023 she participated as a beneficiary under the Gram Parivartan project., DBF provided her with training, technical knowledge, and both low and high-yielding seeds. Empowered with these resources, Mrs. Gita transitioned to cultivating high-value vegetables such as Cauliflower, Tomato, Brinjal, and Cabbage. As a result, she earned an annual additional income of Rs. 55,000 in a year. Mrs. Lakra expressed her heartfelt gratitude towards the Foundation for their invaluable support.
