Livelihood Initiatives

Vegetable Cultivation and Kitchen Garden

- Vegetable cultivation was introduced in a 10-cents model involving 328 farmers.
- Kitchen gardens were promoted among 148 households to address nutritional supplements and enhance income for poor families.
- 15 field training sessions were organized on vegetable cultivation.
- Farmers are expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 60,000 from sale of vegetable crops.





Mushroom Cultivation

- Mushroom farming has expanded to 19 villages following training programs.
- **282 households** are actively engaged in mushroom cultivation.
- Each household is expected to earn a profit of Rs. 50,000 annually.

Orchard, Apiary and Poultry farming

- 16 solar and electric river lifts were installed in the WADI field aiming to irrigate 100 acres in convergence with Odisha Agro Industries Corporation.
- 1,111 poultry beneficiaries are expected to earned an additional income ranging from Rs. 14,000 to Rs. 17,000 per batch.
- 22 families were supported for apiary farming under the WADI project and is expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 60,000 to Rs. 70,000.









Micro-Enterprise Initiatives

- 7 Households were supported for initiating microenterprise initiatives
- Support is provided for setting up of grocery shops, garment shops, mobile repairing shops, chicken shops,
- fast food centers, and panipuri carts, etc.
- Expected additional annual income would be more than Rs. 1,00,000/- per beneficiary.


