Team DBF, Ramgarh

LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



- → 21 micro-enterprises were established across various trades like, Barbering, Carpentry, Beauty parlour, Provisional stores, Pottery, Cycle-pulled hawking, and Cycle-repairing.
- → Enables self-employment opportunities.
- → Facilitates skills development among community members.
- → Each Micro-enterprise has the potential to earn Rs. 2.4 lakhs annually.

Micro-enterprises

- Azolla beds were provided to 250 beneficiaries.
- → This initiative has led to an increase in both the quantity and quality of milk, as well as weight gain in goats and cows.
- → Farmers have been able to reduce feed costs by incorporating Azolla into their livestock's diet, replacing a considerable quantity of other feeds.
- → Azolla is also being utilized by poultry and goat-rearing farmers.
- → A household with 3-5 goats and two cows has the potential to earn Rs. 18,000 by providing Azolla as a feed.



Distribution and Installation of Azolla Beds



- → 1000 vermicompost bags were distributed to farmers
- → Per bag produces 3 ton of vermi compost.
- → Each farmer has the potential to earn an annual income of Rs. 22,000/- per bag.

Vermi Compost

- → 7 farmers received training supported by Kheyti Team.
- → Two training programs conducted for poly house farmers
- → 25 poly house farmers received training on advanced techniques and seed procurement.
- → Each farmer has the potential to earn an additional amount of Rs.1.04 lakhs annually.



Krishi Urja Suraksha evam Utthaan Mahabhiyan Yojana (KUSUM Yojana) Initiatives

- → Empowering Rural Women Artisans to preserve Moonj Craft through Sarayan Craft Initiatives.
- → 250 women artisans were benefitted, fostering gender equality and economic independence.
- → The business achieved a turnover of Rs. 10.53 lakhs.
- → Established collaborations and partnerships with companies such as Women on Wings and PepsiCo.



Kheyti Intervention – (Protective farming)

- → 6 farmers were supported with Sustainable and Renewable Energy based Agricultural Practices.
- → The government provided two farmers with 5 Horse Power solar pumps worth Rs. 2 lakhs and four farmers with 3 Horse Power solar pumps worth Rs.14 lakhs.
- → This initiative helps to reduce reliance on fuel oil or electricity for irrigation, leading to direct savings of up to Rs. 12,500 per hectare on irrigation costs.
- → Farmers become Energy Entrepreneurs as they sell excess electricity to the grid at a rate of Rs. 350 per hour.



Moonj Craft: Sarayan Craft Initiatives

Climate Action



- → 12 recharge shafts were constructed.
- → Annual water harvesting capacity: 240,000 cubic meters.
- → 1,600 villagers were benefitted from this intervention.

Recharge Shaft

- → 1100-meter pipeline has been installed.
- → 385 farmers were benefitted covering 500 acres of farmland for irrigation



Water ETP (Excess Water Supply Pipeline)



- → Annual water harvesting capacity: 11.32 lakh kilolitres (KL).
- → 15,000 individuals were directly benefitted.



Water Harvesting Structure (Village Pond)

- → Revolutionizes crop irrigation in Ramgarh.
- → Serves 6 beneficiaries across 25 hectares of farm land.

Climate Action



- → Located in Mishrikh, Sitapur district.
- Aims to reverse environmental degradation and enhance biodiversity.
- > 6,800 individuals were benefitted from this project.

Mandakini River Restoration Project

- → 9,707 quintals of press mud distributed to 730 farmers.
- → Average application rate is 50 quintals per hectare.
- → 3,176 hectares of sugarcane cultivable land is covered.
- → Each farmer has the potential to earn an additional amount of Rs. 18,000/- to Rs. 23,000/- per crop annually



Press Mud Distribution



- → Performed 1589 traditional AI procedures and 383 conventional AI procedures.
- → Resulted in 146 calves born, in which 130 calves were female.
- Enhanced livestock productivity and Ensured economic sustainability.
- → The potential earning would be Rs. 85,000/- from each buffalo and female calve.

Dairy Development Through AI

- → Enhanced livelihood resilience and Empower farmers with skills and knowledge.
- 4 livelihood trainings were conducted, including Infertility Camps to empower farmers with skills and knowledge.
- → 517 cattle were treated for infertility and Dewormed 221 female calves.
- → 276 families were benefitted.

SEEKHO SEEKHAO FOUNDATION: UNDER THE SCHOOL SUPPORTS PROGRAMME



- > 33 smart TVs distributed in schools.
- → 4,113 students were benefitted.

Distribution of Smart TVs (Smart TVs Classroom)

- → 25 computer setups installed in 5 schools, Benefiting 1,131 students.
- → This helped the student from the rural background to attain knowledge of basic computer and digital literacy.




