Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

Remunerative Bamboo Plantations

Bamboo plantation as AFR has been going on for the last 3 years in Umrangso. So far 1,32,500 bamboo saplings have been planted covering 662.5 acres of land in 20 villages. 629 farmers are growing bamboo. 1st lot of bamboo will be ready for harvest in the year 2025, yield is expected to be 25-30 MT per acre and farmers will be able to earn Rs.50,000 per acre. The yield and income will increase in the subsequent years as density of bamboo bushes increase. The DBF team is providing hand holding support for plantation and growth monitoring to farmers. In collaboration with GIZ, training sessions are being organized to optimize bamboo growth by following best practices in a precise manner.

SKILLING RURAL HOUSEHOLDS IN HOMESTEAD GARDENING



- ➔ 143 farmers trained in homestead garden.
- ➔ Land preparation started for winter vegetable cultivation
- ➔ Seeds of different types of vegetables will be provided by mid-October.

SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE



- ➔ Independence Day was celebrated in Langcherui.
- ➔ About 400 children, SHG women, youths, and other villagers participated.

- 1 general health camp organized
- 67 individuals benefited
- Free medicines distributed
- Awareness session held on prevention of water and air borne diseases



- Program on tribal empowerment held.
- 70 women SHG members along with NRLM officials participated.
- Topics such as book keeping, credit worthy status of SHG, importance of loan repayment, general financial management and investments were discussed
